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his annotated bibliography was created to document and catalogue the many resources that have been produced and published in the aboriginal languages here in the Northwest Territories. Aboriginal language groups from throughout the Northwest Territories were invited to submit their resources. The only qualifier was that the resource must be written in a northern aboriginal language. This collection represents the aboriginal language books published in six aboriginal languages: Cree (nehiyawin), North Slavey, South Slavey (Dene Yatie), Chipewyan (Dëne Suhn Yatı), Thcho and Gwich'in. Altogether almost 500 books, CD's, DVD's, kits and posters have been catalogued for this bibliography. This in itself is a reason to celebrate and is an indication of the commitment shown by Teaching and Learning Centers and various Community Language Groups in creating and publishing quality aboriginal language resources for use in the communities in support of aboriginal language programming.

This resource will be updated in an electronic format as new books and kits are published and submitted for review. Several organizations have created links to this electronic resource through their web sites including the following:

The resource is written only in the Aboriginal language.



The resource has both English and the Aboriginal text on the same page.



The English and Aboriginal text appear on different pages.

- Level 1 The text is written in a simple format with easy to read words, larger type and page-to-page picture support. The book may feature repetitive text and predictible outcomes. The content is appropriate to a younger reader.
- Level 2 The text is more complicated with multiple sentences appearing on the same page. Generally there is picture support and the content is appropriate to both younger and older readers.
- Level 3 The text is challenging and may be written in paragraph form. There is limited picture support and the content is generally of interest to the more mature and advanced reader.
- Reference This resource is intended to be a reference guide suitable to all.
- The resource includes a CD or DVD for aboriginal language support in an audiovisual format.
- The text features repetitive sentence patterns and is appropriate to someone just earning the aboriginal language.
